

A/ Zero conditional

These are sentences that are true in general, often used for always true rules, etc.

If means when/ whenever.

If you mix red and blue, you get violet.

If you tell him jokes, he always laughs.

if + present tense, present tense

1 Milk often goes off	a if you heat it.
2 My mum often gets furious	b if you don't put it into the fridge.
3 Metal expands	c if I have bad results.

B/ First conditional

These conditionals express a possible condition and probable result in the future.

If I find your glasses, I will send them to you.

if + present tense, future form/ might/ must/ should/ can

1 If my boyfriend calls,	a we might go skiing at Christmas.
2 If you feel sick,	b you must come and see me.
3 If you are in Prague,	c tell him I will call him back later.
4 If I earn a lot of money,	d you should go to bed and keep some diet.

C/ Second conditional

These sentences express improbable, impossible, imaginary, or contrary situation or condition to known facts.

If I found money on the way, I wouldn't work.

if + past simple, would + verb (other modal are possible- could, might)

1 If your mum wasn't careful,	a you might save some money.
2 If I were you,	b I would apologise.
3 If you bought less things every Friday,	c she could be in trouble.



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D/ Third conditional

They are used to express impossible situation in the past and its probable result. These things didn't happen, or they happened and it is too late.

If I had trained, I could/might have become a professional cook.

If I had known it, I wouldn't have left my mum.

**if + past perfect, would/ could/ might + have + past participle
(could and might mean possibility)**
